CJJ recently added an Associate Director position to support TA efforts for our members.

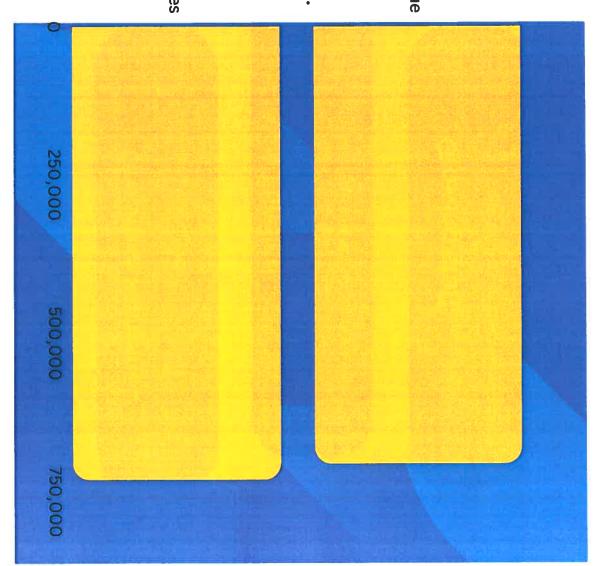

2022 Revenue v. Expenses

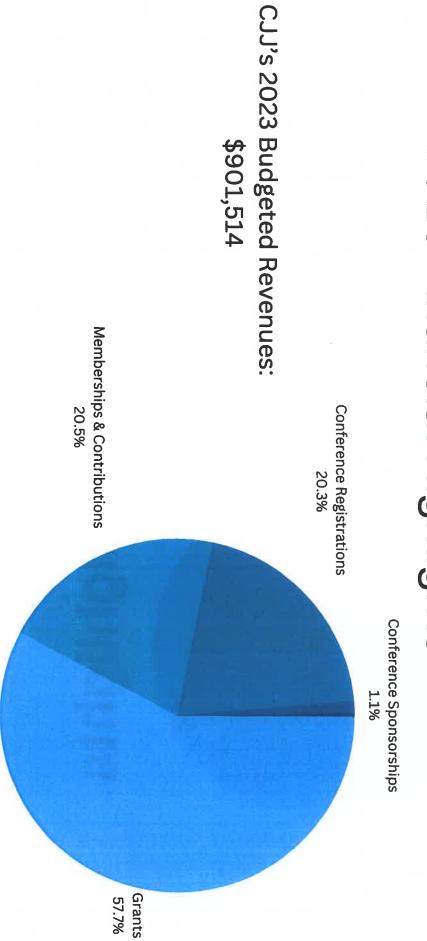
Revenue

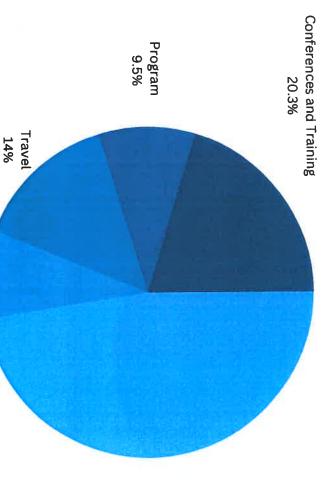
